CIRCUIT-WIDE RESTRICTIONS ON ACCESS TO COURTHOUSES CONTINUED


For those reasons referred to in numerous prior COVID-19 related Administrative Orders* entered circuit-wide and in the individual counties of the Tenth Circuit, and in light of Governor Pritzker's extension of the 'stay at home' Executive Order through April of 2020, all such prior Orders are continued through April 30, 2020 regarding restrictions on access to the courthouses of the Tenth Circuit.

Specifically, it is expected that no member of the public will be allowed in the courthouses through April of 2020 regarding court business, absent specific order of the respective presiding or resident circuit judge of the applicable county. As before, essential court staff may still appear during this time to conduct essential court/government business. Regular court business may still be conducted remotely by phone or video conference per prior Admin. Orders at the discretion of the respective courtroom judge.

If a member of the public had an in person hearing on a matter previously scheduled during this time, they are instructed to contact their attorney, court advocate or the circuit clerk's office by phone, on line or via regular mail or drop box.
