WHEREAS, out of an abundance of caution for the safety and health of the Court Services Personnel, judges, law enforcement personnel, and the general public, pursuant to 725 ILCS 5/107-12 and the discretion of the Resident Circuit Judge in these unprecedented times concerning the COVID-19 pandemic as declared by state and federal officials,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, TEMPORARILY, with respect to any Shelby County warrants issued in relation to civil matters or misdemeanor offenses **except** offenses of domestic battery or violation of order of protection or criminal sexual abuse, it is hereby administratively ordered that law enforcement may satisfy the obligation of the Shelby County warrant by issuing the defendant a notice to appear or recognizance bond. This does not apply to felony matters (except as to failures to appear for pay or appear) and any request to satisfy the Shelby County felony warrant with a notice to appear or recognizance bond must be approved by a judge. All court dates issued shall be set between the dates of May 11, 2020 and June 30, 2020.

This Order remains in effect until further Order of Court. The Court will continue to review and adjust the Order as is necessary.
